Security Matters

Hello everyone! Since the show is quickly approaching, we are working hard with the new security procedures. After visiting other events around the country, I feel we are putting together a plan that compares to them. This has been a very educational process for us and we have learned a great deal. Over the next few weeks, we will fine tune our procedures with everything from clear bags to how entry procedures will work for our customers. Detection devices will be placed at entry locations and security fencing will be placed in certain locations around the park.

This year Park-n-Ride will remain located at Exit 10D Happy Jack Rd and Missile Drive. The traffic flow will return to **right turn only** around the park, as buses travel up Hynds Blvd. where the new bus lane is currently being constructed. Volunteer Park-n-Ride will remain at Central High School.

The 125th "Daddy of 'em All"® will be a testament to the dedication of all our volunteers that make every year possible. We have been planning for this show with recommendations and ideas from the

volunteers to make sure the show goes on. We have had very productive workdays and meetings to ensure the 125th is everything we want it to be. I am proud to have served the last four years as the Security Committee Chairman. Security for events like ours have had to face some hard facts that change has to happen. This change is not pleasant but due to world events is needed.

TICKET TALK

There is excitement in the air as we prepare for the patrons in receiving a ride, please give our dispatcher 125th "Daddy of 'em All." There are many changes for this year's show as many of you are aware. As part so that the drivers can find of our COVID response plan submitted to the State of Wyoming and the County, we committed to limit contact with the public and one way to do that was to change tickets to a digital platform. Please make sure that your phone is charged and that you have pulled your tickets up prior to arrival at the park for ease of use. Using Apple or Google wallet is the best way to access your ticket, and cellular data or Wi-Fi is not required. Please help us help our customers by making many ups and downs sure that everyone you encounter is aware of this and has their tickets ready for scanning at these locations. If you, or any of our patrons, have any questions, please refer them to the Ticket Office or to **cfdrodeo.com**. Patrons with tickets in any of the General Admission Party Zone areas will be scanned in and out, and will be required to attend the event in the area in which they purchased their tickets. Attempting to scan tickets into alternate party zone GA areas will not be permitted by the scanners. Guests have been notified that they must have tickets with them at all times to verify seating and events.

Another change is the \$5 Gate Admissions tickets will be sold at the Ticket Office instead of the Front Gate. The windows at the Front Gate will be utilized for Will Call for those who chose to purchase hard tickets.

Disability Services is also changing their routes due to all the changes around the park, including the new Park-n-Ride drop-off location, security fencing, food, and carnival area redesign. When assisting


them efficiently. Also, we will no longer be providing the people mover service between B & C lots.


